This apostolate of being the bearers of the good news does not consist of word alone. Above all, it consists in being a living witness of one who is living out his/her Christianity with all of its consequences.

We become the witnesses through which the world can recognize that Christ is alive today. **He is alive through and in us**.



Each one of us, in our lives, depending on our personality and our circumstances must give the world a bit of the truth and good news since we are laypersons.

This is what it means to be a Christian, a layperson, living in the world today. It gives us an opportunity to make **our life a living translation of the Gospel by what we do,** nothing more than that. We bring Christ with us wherever we go and in whatever we do in our normal everyday lives. We live in grace to transform the world to Christ.
