



THE SCHOOL OF LEADERS

SOL PRESENTATIONS for

July, August & September 2023 By Sis Gid Eugenio

Our July SOL doctrinal presentation on "Journeying with the Holy Spirit in Crucial Conversations" by Deacon Noe Tuason set the tone on learning how to listen to the Holy Spirit in times of divisions and misunderstandings within our community. Deacon Noe did a wonderful job explaining to us the wisdom of Spirituality of Synodality — teaching us how to be open to the Holy Spirit guiding us through our listening to each other, dialogue, and discernment. We learn that in dialogue, we don't argue or confront, we seek only what is objective, what is true, noble and good or the common good of all keeping in mind the true purpose, essence and mentality of the Cursillo Movement. School of Leaders met in person for the first time after the pandemic at Our Lady of Good Counsel in July and incorporated the so-called "Townhall 2" into the SOL agenda as "Listening Session" instead. The intention is to change the political "townhall" mindset into a "Spirit of Synodality" to steer the direction of our community from confrontational conflict back into communion and fraternal dialogue and discernment in facing those issues.

As I've mentioned before, sometimes it is easy to forget the most basic and simple truths of what we are called to "be" as Christian Cursillistas without continually discerning the will of God in our lives. The book "Whom Shall I Send? Discerning The Will of God" by Fr. Frank Salmani is a powerful tool to guide us as Cursillo servant leaders.

In August SOL, the Technical talk was on *Chapter 6: Allegiances: Paul or Apollos?* and *Chapter 7: Cursillo "and" Christ Vs. Cursillo "or" Christ* - presented by bro. *Anito Acaba* of *Transfiguration team*. Bro. Anito reminded us on what he learned from bro. Dan's talk on "attachments" that it is the source of forming allegiances and alliances within a group. Whether in a religious or secular group; people tend to have allegiances to a certain clique, group or person. Very often problems arise within a community because the allegiance is not to the IDEAL or purpose or work to be done, but to personalities.

This happens in business, in families, and even within religious circles; when it does happen, the group loses its focus. According to **Fr. Salmani** (author of the book), "If we are going to be apostles of Jesus, we must put aside all allegiances and attachments and follow Jesus alone."

Therefore in *Chapter 7: Cursillo "and" Christ Vs. Cursillo "or" Christ*, we learned that there is no distinction between Christ, the Church, and the Cursillo. The end and purpose of each one is one and the same. Thank you, bro. Anito, for your inspiring and encouraging SOL Technical talk for the month of August.

In September, the SOL Technical Talk was on *Chapter 8: Covenants and Commitments and Chapter 9: Spiritual and Political Power* presented to us by bro. Art de Leon of the Pilgrims Team. Bro. Art stated in his talk on *Covenants and Commitments* that in order to "discern God's Call and to properly answer His Call we need three things: Idealism (refers to our highest lifetime ultimate goal), Self-surrender (our willingness to offer ourselves) and Charity (a selfless act of love for others)." Bro. Art also mentioned that "God wants the best for us, so we need to give Him our 100% effort. We have to be open to His Call and to listen and NOT come to Him with our own agenda. The mentality of the Cursillo is not a matter of debate, but a DECISION and to ask ourselves, "Is this what God wants from me to do right now?" We can only answer this if we are honest with ourselves and listen to God's Will for us. All of this process must be done out of love. And ultimately, we can only decide for ourselves for nobody will."

Regarding the chapter on **Spiritual and Political Power**, bro. Art beautifully concluded this topic with this statement: "The power of leadership is deeply rooted upon humble service we give to God's people. Thus, in the case of the Cursillo Movement/Group Reunion, through friendship, it is intended to draw out the Christ in each one of us by unitedly working together. We as leaders and servants of Christ are called to that higher power — one that comes not from ambition, but humility which is a power and strength itself that no force in heaven or on earth can ever take away from us and whose source is the ONE who came so that we might have life and have it to the fullest." Thank you, bro. Art de Leon for presenting these essential qualities needed to be a good Cursillo Leader.

It is almost end of summertime in the States; at this time, we are travelling the Mediterranean region by sea.

From **Barcelona**, we visited Sagrada Familia (the largest unfinished Catholic Church in the world). To purchase tickets, it will require doing it online and schedule to go inside Sagrada Familia. There's no assurance that your group can go together. Shirts and tops covering the shoulders required. When you are visiting Sagrada Familia, remember to wear clothing with sleeves that completely cover your shoulders. Make sure to carry shawls and jackets. Full trousers and mid-length skirts – Visitors are required to wear skirts and trousers that come below the mid-thighs. There were wall to wall people outside.

The next stop is **Gibraltar**, a British Overseas Territory and headland, on Spain's south coast. IT's dominated by the Rock of Gibraltar, a 426m-high limestone ridge. First settled by the Moors in the Middle Ages and later ruled by Spain, the outpost was ceded to the British in 1713. Layers of fortifications include the remains of a 14th-century Moorish Castle and the 18th century Great Siege Tunnels, which were expanded in WWII. The Rock of Gibraltar and Mount Jebel Musa in Morocco stand majestically dominating the entrance to the Mediterranean. Ancient mariners arriving at Rock left gifts to the gods, seeking their blessings before sailing into the unknown.

Marseille is a charming port city in southern France, has been a crossroads of immigration and trade since its founding by the Greeks circa 600 B.C. At its heart is the Vieux-Port (Old Port), where fishmongers sell their catch along the boat-lined quay. Basilique Notre-Dame-de-la-Garde is a Romanesque-Byzantine

church. Modern landmarks include Le Corbusier's influential Cite Radieuse complex and Zaha Hadid's CMA CGM Tower.
